GENERAL REGULATIONS:

Junior Fair Regulations, Ag 160, Exhibit Rules, Health Rules, Animal ID Check-In

HORSE EXHIBIT REGULATIONS:

Exhibitor Should Check on Health Rules Governing the Exhibition of Horses.

A COPY OF YOUR COGGINS PAPERS MUST BE ATTACHED TO YOUR ANIMAL ID FORM

- 1. Junior Fair exhibits are limited to Vernon County residents.
- 2. Exhibitors are responsible for their own exhibits. The Vernon County Agricultural Society will provide reasonable security for all exhibits but assumes no liability for exhibits damaged or lost during the exhibit period.
- 3. No Junior Fair exhibitors will be allowed to stay on the grounds overnight in any buildings on the grounds. This rule will be enforced by night security and by the Board of Directors of the Agricultural Society.
- 4. Veterinary services performed on grounds will be paid for by exhibitor.
- Persons using fairgrounds' wash racks must use biodegradable soap only, when washing animals. State regulations prohibit nonbiodegradable soap residue in the wastewater generated.
- 6. The use of common watering troughs on the Vernon County Fairgrounds is prohibited.
- 7. There shall be no beverages in glass bottles allowed on the grounds. There shall be no smoking in any buildings.
- You must have original coggins paper at the fair.
- 9. Each exhibitor is limited to one animal, except youth who have exhibited for 2 years at the Vernon County Fair and in at least their 3rd year of the horse project may exhibit 2 horses maximum.
- 10. Two exhibitors from the same family may enter the same animal in only the showmanship class and the horsemanship class. One of the 2 exhibitors from the same family may also enter the animal in either the pleasure or the halter class.
- 11. No stallions born before January 1 of the exhibit year will be allowed to show.
- 12. No Premium Check for Class K.
- 13. Indicate on entry sheet if you have two horses.
- 14. Weanlings and yearlings Exhibitor must be grade 8 or have 3 years experience in horse project to show, and animal must be entered in regular (mature animal) classes.
- 15. Exhibitor must notify Gateman 3 classes in advance if class conflicts with other exhibits.
- 16. Horse posters may be entered in Department 10 Veterinary Science.
- 17. Exhibitors need to pick up droppings from horse going to and from show and exercising.
- 18. All horses must be checked by the veterinarian prior to entering the fairgrounds.
- 19. All paperwork accompanying the horse will be given to the superintendent once in the barn.
- 20. Only the exhibitor is allowed to ride, school, or drive the horse.
- 21. SEÍ approved helmets with a secured safety strap requires wherever and exhibitor is riding or driving a horse. Proper attire should be worn in the show ring. Western: Helmet or hat for showmanship/halter, boots long pants, long sleeve shirt (button down) and belt. English: Helmet, coat, shirt, pants and boots. Driving: Helmet and appropriate clothing.
- 22. The annual Horse and Pony Project Check List on the Vernon County Fair Website www.vernoncountyfair.com to be completed and signed by youth advisor and exhibitor.
- 23. See the 4-H Horse & Pony Project Safety Check List on the Vernon County Fair Website at www.vernoncountyfair.com Also check the Vernon County 4-H Office for further information.
- 24. Horses need to be exercised at least once each day
- 25. See Animal Check-In Procedures for additional details.

Guidelines for Stalling Horses at the Fair:

In order to address the potential that there may be more entries than available stalls, the following will reflect the policy of the Vernon County Fair Board and the procedure(s) to determine which horses are to be stalled at the fair.

The Fair Board will determine on an annual basis whether or not there are additional stalls available in any other barns.

Only if the horse barn stalls are filled to capacity and no other space is available. Exhibitors with two horses entered will be allowed to show the second horse by trailering in on the morning of the show and only that second horse will be released at the conclusion of the show.

Stalling of horses will be prioritized by the number of years the exhibitor has shown at the Vernon County Fair. In case of a tie, the determination will by drawing system. Exhibitor's full name will be put into a drawing and pulled by the horse superintendent. If you are selected as a person that needs to trailer your horse(s) to and from the fair grounds this year, due to not enough stalls available. You will be exempt from having to trailer your horses, for the next three years.

This policy will be reviewed annually.

DEPARTMENTAL REGULATIONS:

This Junior show is open to equine including ponies, lights horses, donkeys and mules.

Ponies are less than 56" tall. Mini's are considered ponies.

Horses are 57" or taller.

Donkeys are less than 56".

Mules are 57" or taller.

Danish judging is based on the exhibitor's ability to maneuver the animal.

Regular judging is based on the animal itself.
