#### GENERAL REGULATIONS:

Junior Fair Regulations, Ag 160, ATPC 10.40, Exhibit Rules, Health Rules, Animal ID Check-In

#### POULTRY EXHIBITS REGULATIONS:

##### Exhibitor Should Check on Health Rules Governing the Exhibition of Poultry.

1. Open class exhibits in the classes of Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goats, Beef Cattle, Sheep and Draft Horses are open to any resident of Wisconsin.
2. Exhibitors are responsible for their own exhibits. The Vernon County Agricultural Society will provide reasonable security for all exhibits but assumes no liability for exhibits damaged or lost during the exhibit period.
3. No Junior Fair exhibitors will be allowed to stay on the grounds overnight in any buildings on the grounds. This rule will be enforced by night security and by the Board of Directors of the Agricultural Society.
4. Veterinary services performed on grounds will be paid for by exhibitor.
5. Persons using fairgrounds' wash racks must use biodegradable soap only, when washing animals. State regulations prohibit non-biodegradable soap residue in the wastewater generated.
6. There shall be no beverages in glass bottles allowed on the grounds.
7. There shall be no smoking in any buildings.
8. All birds exhibited must be of recognized breed and must have been reared by the exhibitor.
9. Exhibitors will provide their own feed (place feed in covered pail clearly marked with the exhibitors name) and are responsible for feeding and watering their animals unless prior arrangements have been made with the Superintendent or another exhibitor for care of stock. Exhibitors may be asked to take a turn on **Barn Duty**.
10. Exhibitors are expected to bedden and maintain, also clean cages. Bedding will be provided.
11. Any other Standard Variety means birds found in the Poultry Standard of Perfection Book, it does not mean crossbreds.
12. Crossbreds can only be entered in the crossbred class or market class.
13. No Guineas
14. All entries shall be composed of individuals hatched during the current calendar year after January 1st.
15. Any member having an animal in the meat animal sale shall be in the showmanship contest.
16. All poultry must be checked by the veterinarian prior to entering the fairgrounds.
17. All paperwork accompanying the poultry will be given to the superintendent once in the barn.
18. See Animal Check-In Procedures for additional details.
19. **All birds must be entered singly. One poultry per lot.**
20. **Junior Fair exhibitors cannot enter two birds in the same class or lot.**
21. **Exhibitors limited to maximum of 14 chickens and 6 additional entries in poultry department**
