

Department 119--Reminder your submissions should be at least 50 years old. If you have a story to go with your pieces –please tell it on your tag or an index card.

CLASS A

Alarm Clock –wind up only.

Any item 100 years or older –please keep your item small

Ashtray –typical or wild and wacky! Glass, ceramic, porcelain, or metal. No advertising in this category. No Standing ashtrays.

Bank -any item that will accept coins.

Beer Stein –typically ceramic, but may be metal or glass.

Bowl, china –typically a round container with a wide, uncovered top made from a hard white substance.

Bowl, depression glass –may come in blue, pink, green, clear, amber, black, red or white. If you know your pattern name, list it on your tag.

Bowl, pottery, stoneware –more rustic, has an earthy texture and stonelike quality with a more unrefined finish, typically heavier than porcelain and is made from clay.

Butter dish with cover –glass, ceramic, pottery, aluminum, or stainless. Cake plate, glass -will be round, clear or colored, may have a lip or feet.

Carnival Glass piece –colors may be blue iridescent, amber, marigold and green. Old pieces will generally show scratches and have a dull base. If you know the name of your pattern, list it on your tag.

Casserole dish with cover –a deep, large, oven-safe pan used for cooking and serving a variety of dishes. Often made of ceramic, porcelain, or glass, and are known for their heavy-duty construction that is ideal for cooking dishes that require long, slow cooking.

Cast Iron item –trivet, pan, pot, bookend, or any other item

Cookie jar --may be novelty --apple, figure, animal, person, or any other shape.

Copper --any item.

Crock -- (jugs are in Lot 20)

Dinner ware place settings -- 3 pieces, examples are cup, saucer, dinner plate or dinner plate, fruit bowl, dessert plate

Drinking Glass --11 to 16 ounce, may be colored, or glass with a pattern.

Egg beater --Don't forget to see if your eggbeater came from the 1960's --it might be an antique!

Enamel or Granite Ware --coffee pot, lunch bucket, roaster, bowl, teapot, mug or pitcher. Green, blue gray, cream, or white

Glass Basket --should have a handle, may be crystal, clear, or colored.

Glass Bottle --The theme for 2025 will be green or blue.

Glass Candle Holder -1 candle holder, may be clear or colored

Glass Food Container --may be a jar, must have a cover. Cover may be glass, metal, or plastic.

Glass Vase --The color for 2025 is amber or yellow.

Gravy Boat -- A sauce boat, gravy boat, or saucière is a low jug or pitcher with a handle and a long lip in which sauce or gravy is served. Often with a footed base or a separate or attached tray. The typical shape is considered boat-like.

Hobnail --also known as Dewdrop, has small button-like bumps as the decoration, translucent colors or white

Jello/Gelatin Mold --come in aluminum, copper, ceramic, ironstone, or glass. Used to shape a dessert made with a flavored gelatin. The desserts were often layered with other ingredients like fruit and condensed milk.

Jug --stoneware or ceramic, typically have a tapered top with a spout.

Kitchen canister –Up to 4 pieces, examples may be crockery, metal or wood from the 1960s, or Tupperware. Many canisters from the 1950's are aluminum and many from the 1940's are ceramic. Many will indicate what the container is used for. For example: Flour, Sugar, Coffee, Tea, Rice, Salt, etc.

Kitchen Utensils, Collection of 2-3 items –Vintage utensils may be all metal or many have a red or green wooden handle. Items from the 1960's might have melamine handles or brown wooden handles. Items from the early 1970s might be made of all melamine or have melamine or wood handles.

Kitchen Wire Item –examples would an egg basket, gathering basket, collapsable basket, bottle carrier, whisk, Pyrex metal cradle, steamer, tea strainer are all examples.

Mid Century Modern Planter –from 1930 to 1975 –examples may be Haeger, McCoy, Roseville, Hull. Your planter does not have to be marked.

Milk Glass –an opaque or translucent, milk white or colored glass that can be blown or pressed into a variety of shapes. Colors include blue, pink, yellow, brown, black and white. Milk glass is opaque glass that cannot be seen through. Some items may have a reddish/orange opal appearance when held up to the sunlight.

“Occupied Japan” item –should be clearly marked “Made in Occupied Japan”. Can be any type of item.

Pitcher, glass –can be clear, colored, Depression Glass, have a pattern, be a beer pitcher –as long as it is glass.

Pitcher Pottery –May or may not be marked.

Platter –china, glass, Vernonware, silver, plastic, or ceramic. A large flat dish or plate, typically oval or circular in shape, used for serving food.

Pottery vase, McCoy --Look for the hallmark where the “M” and “c” are entwined, followed by the “C” and “o” overlapping.

Pottery vase, Other, not glass or McCoy –Roseville, Haeger, Redwing, or Hull are examples, but others may be marked Japan, Czechoslovakia, or not marked at all.

Pyrex Bowl, pattern –will have a pattern on them and will be labeled PYREX or pyrex on the bottom.

Pyrex Bowl –Set of bowls, up to 4 bowls, must be marked PYREX or pyrex on the bottom.

Recipe Box –may be wood, metal, plastic. Some will say recipe others may have pictures.

Relish Dish –used to hold an assortment of pickles, olives, or raw vegetables, should be a divided dish. Theme for 2025 is colored.

Salt Box –used for storing salt in the kitchen. Wood, ceramic, or glass will typically say “Salt” on them.

Silver serving pieces, Polished, 2-3 –items must be polished. Examples may include a meat fork, salad servers, large serving spoons, slotted spoon, ladle, butter knife or sugar spoon.

Small Scandinavian Kitchen Piece –Love spoons, wedding spoons, grandma’s rosette iron, fattigmann cutter, and more

Spice Container –may be metal or glass, should name a spice.

Soup Tureen –typically has a slotted cover and a ladle. A large, deep bowl with a lid that is used to serve soup or other foods at the table. Tureens can be oval, round, rectangular, or shaped like animals or wildfowl. They often have fixed handles and a low, domed cover with a knob or handle.

Teapot, China –shorter spout, generally round/stout vessel with a handle and lid. Porcelain, glass, clay, may have a strainer on the inside.

Teapot, Novelty –Wacky and Weird! Cats, dogs, houses, tomatoes, elephants, camels, pineapple, people and more. Not a typical China Teapot.

Tupperware –find an iconic piece from before 1970 that has the Tupperware logo on it. distributed before 1975. Orange, yellow and avocado green were the favorite colors from the 60’s and early 70’s. Pieces from the 40’s and 50’s are white or pastel.

Wooden Item, Other –should not be a kitchen utensil. May be a tray, cheese box, candle stick, or other interesting item.

Wooden Kitchen Utensils, Coll. Of 2-3 –spoons, ladles, forks, butter paddle, spatulas, pestle, salad set, and more. Must be all wood –no metal or plastic.

CLASS B - ANTIQUE TEXTILES

1. Tablecloth, hand crafted –embroidered, crocheted, mixed handwork,
2. Tablecloth, stamped –design is stamped on the cloth
3. Quilt, hand quilted
4. Tatted item –handcrafted lace from a series of knots and loops
5. Handwork, other than above –crocheted doilies, embroidered hankies, embroidered and/or crocheted dresser scarves, etc.

CLASS C – CHILDRENS ANTIQUE

1. Child's dishes, no more than 5 pc.
2. Game –for 2 or more players
3. Toy, small
4. Child's School book –a book that would have been used for learning.

CLASS D - VINTAGE CLOTHING AND ACCESSORIES –1960's and early 1970's is eligible!

1. Adult Special Occasion Clothing –wedding, confirmation, graduation, etc.
2. Summer clothing, child, 2-12 –shorts, shirts, swim suit, etc.
3. Cotton Apron –material must be cotton, can be half apron or bib style.
4. Hat, Women –any hat made before 1975
5. Hat, Men –any hat made before 1975, no caps.

6. Brooch –an ornamental pin fastened to clothing with a hinged pin and catch
7. Bakelite accessory –earrings, bracelet, hair comb or pins, button hook, brush or comb
8. Buttons, 3, mounted –can be original button card or 3 unique buttons mounted on a 3x5 card
9. Woman's necklace
10. Watch, banded or pocket –may be man's or woman's

CLASS E – MISCELLANEOUS ANTIQUES

1. Native American item, small
2. Cookbook, published by organization –church, legion, social club. Local only, not a national group.
3. Vernon County map or plat book
4. Personal Care Item (i.e. Shaving Mug, Dresser set, Compact)
5. Vernon County city/town advertising item
6. Any other advertising item outside of Vernon County
7. Camera
8. Sewing item—pin cushion only
